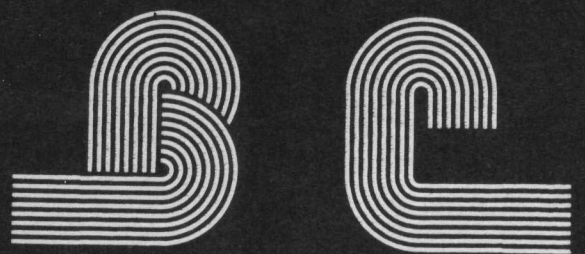



It is not far, it is within reach,

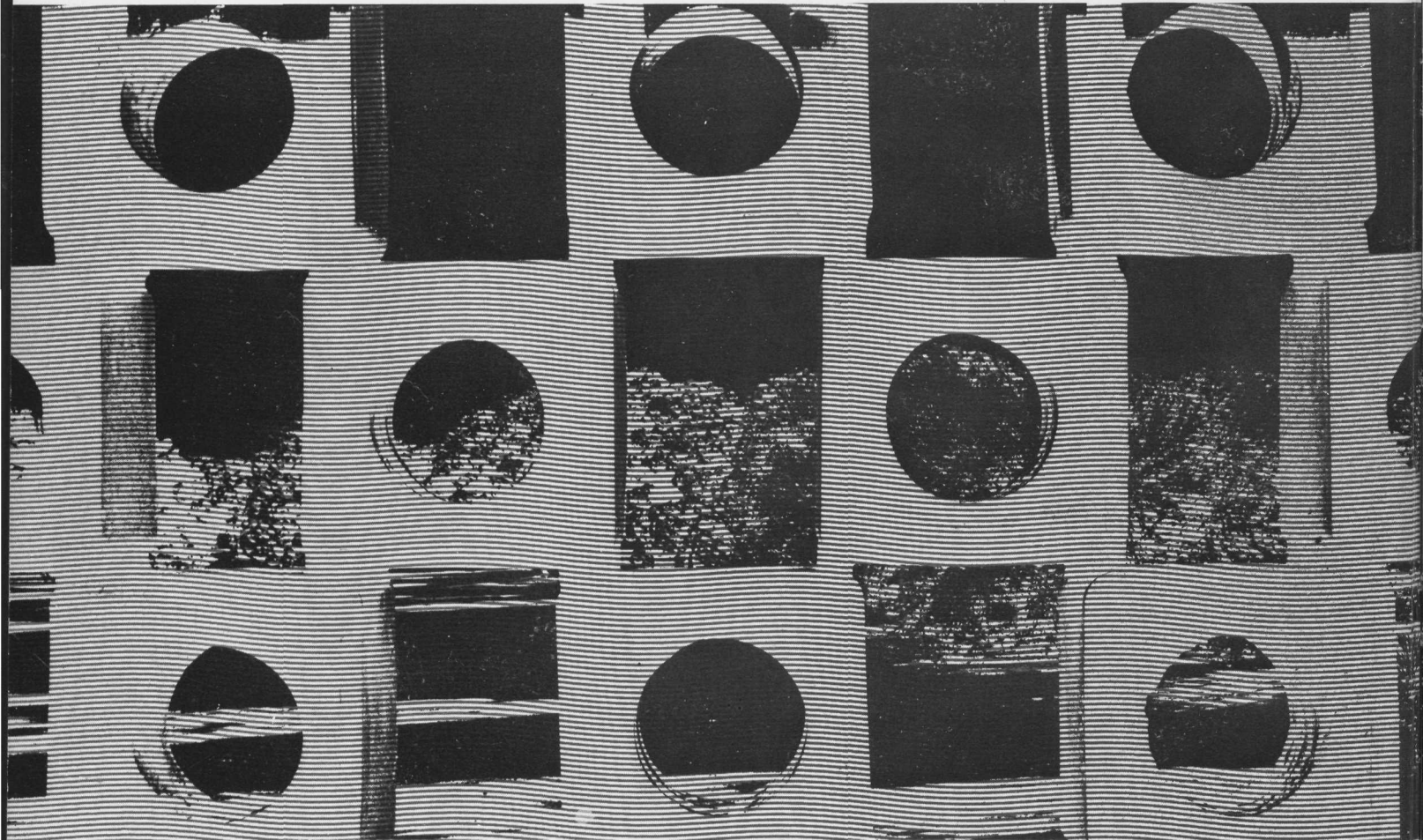

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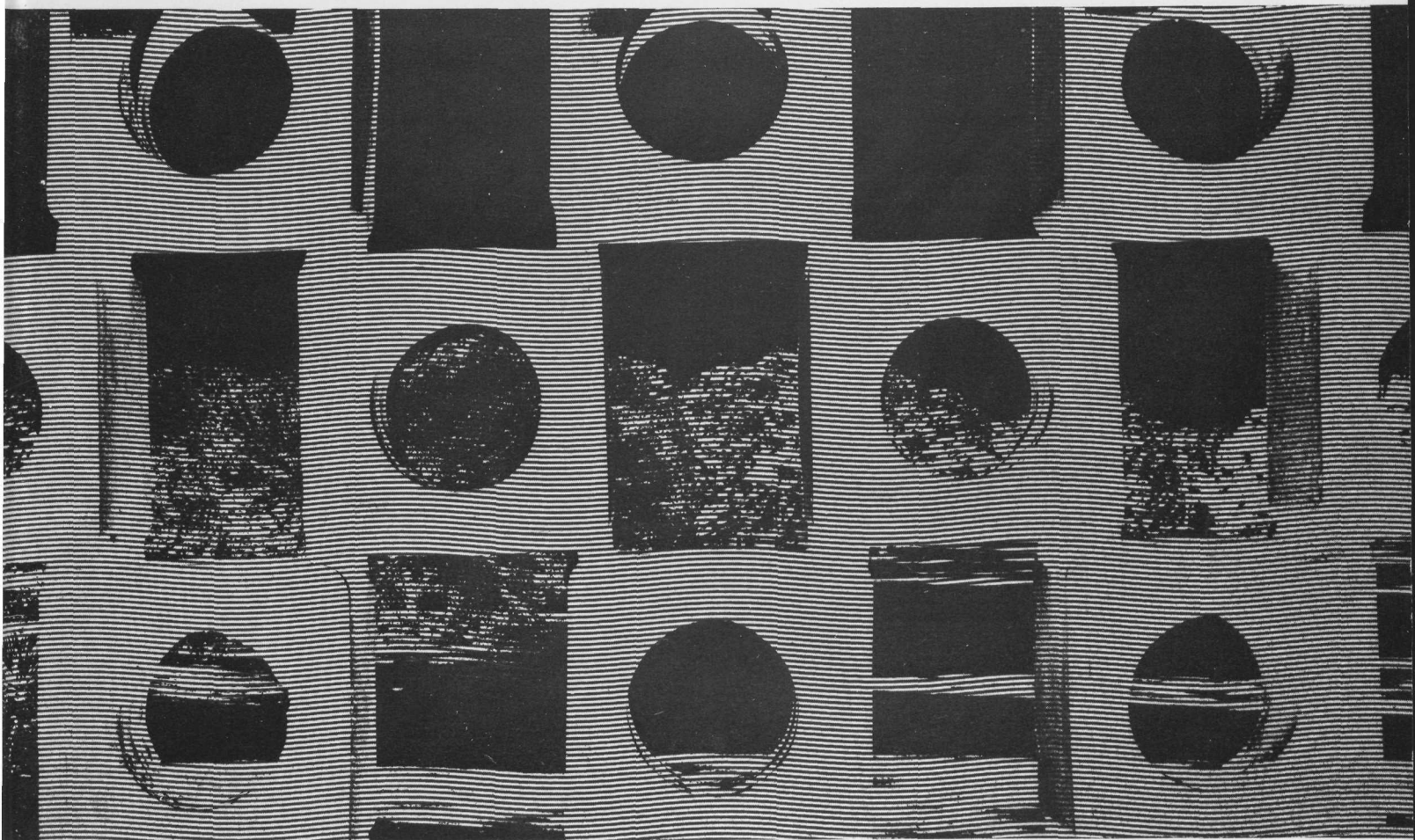

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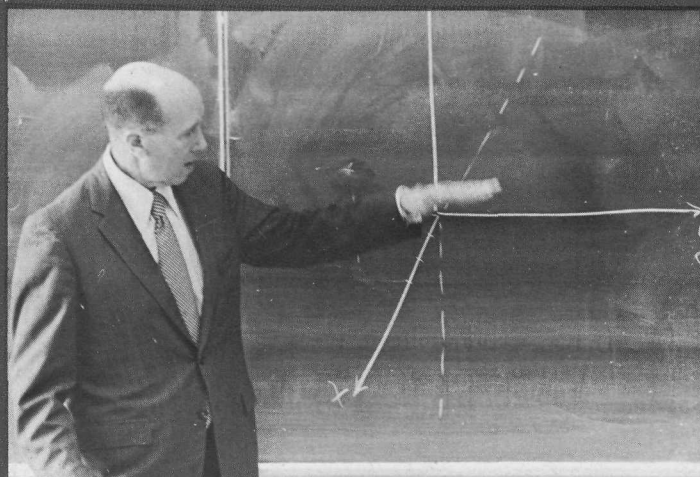

A GREAT MAN

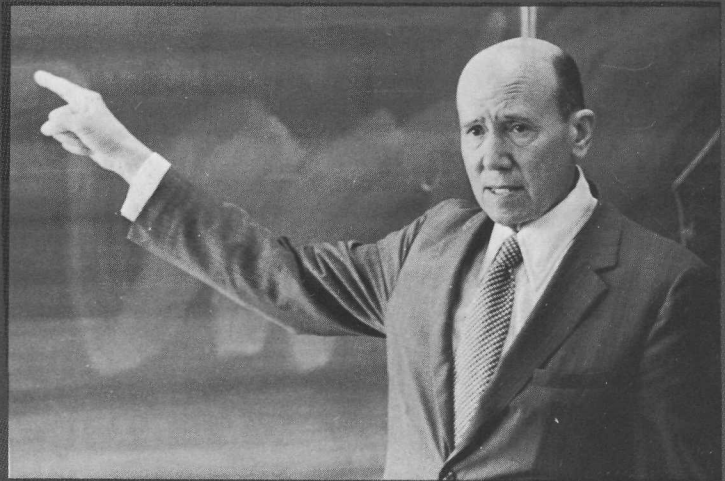
Great. Humble. Thanks. What do these words mean? The answer can be found with Dr. Tomas Rolando, for we dedicate our book to him, a man who has qualities one hears about, seldom sees, and strives to get. Despite these great qualities, Dr. Rolando remains a humble man, who we would like to thank.

Graduating from the University of Habana with a doctorate in Mathematics and Physics, Dr. Rolando also attained a Professorship at the Institute of Habana because of his high standing in a Competitive Examination. In the United States, he has taught in Dayton, Ohio, and at Merrimack College. To keep abreast of the latest in his field, he enrolled in Computer Courses in Boston, Massachusetts. The highest praise came last summer however, when he and his wife, Dr. Josefina Rolando, were honored by being chosen from a select group of scholars to attend a conference held by the Danforth Institution Foundation in Colorado.

Despite these distinctions, Dr. Rolando still remains a humble man. Imprisoned in Cuba during the Bay of Pigs Incident for anti-Castro activities, he was later released, whereupon he came to the United States with his wife, Josefina. Once here, he opened his home to other members of his family who were also fleeing from Communist Cuba. This altruistic attitude can also be seen in the school.

In all three institutions he has taught at, Dr. Rolando has always been highly respected by the faculty and always popular with the students. His scholarship, enthusiasm, excellence in teaching, and above all, friendly attitude, mark him as a great man. No matter how busy, he always has time for his students. As his wife put it: "Teaching is a "bug" with him, he loves his students, that is his life."

After realizing what type of person we are so fortunate to have, what more can we say except: "We give our deepest thanks to you, Dr. Rolando, for being here, for being yourself."



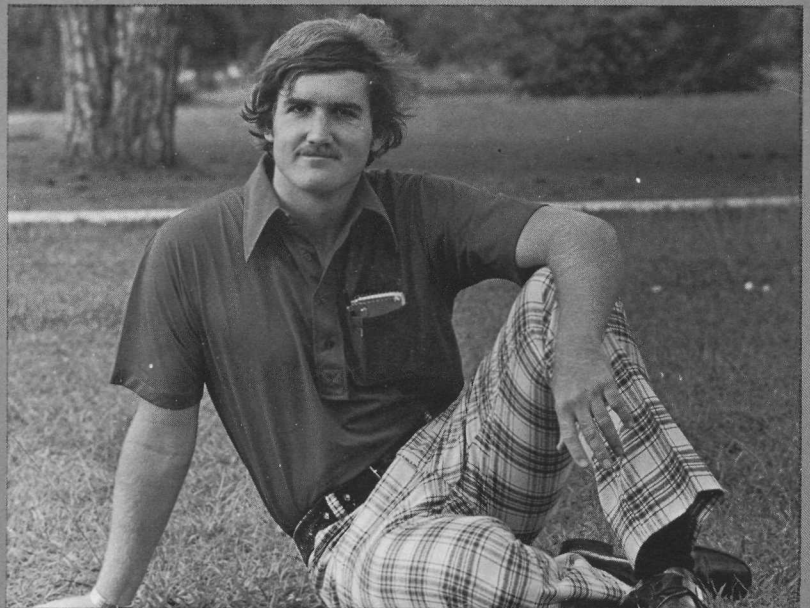
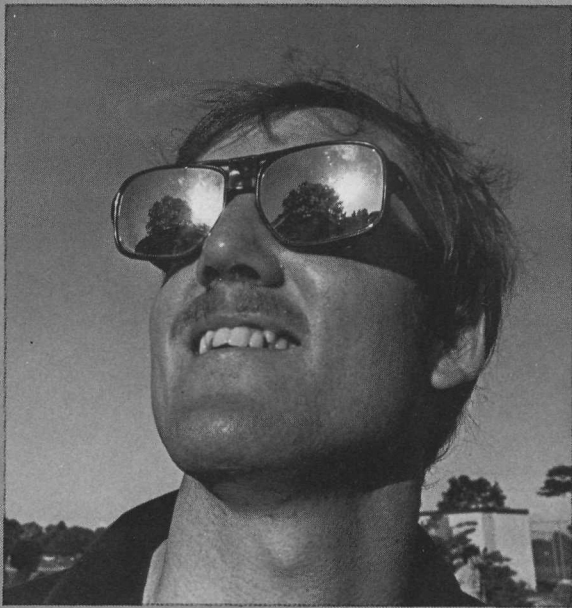

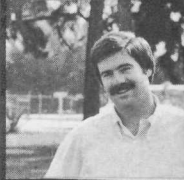
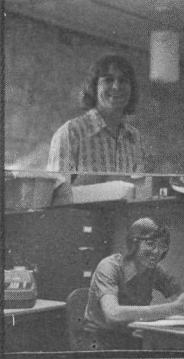


The Unknown Citizen

In an instant, the Freshmen were transformed into long-haired, Supermen of Trouble, screaming shouting babes, carrying on the noble Biscayne tradition.

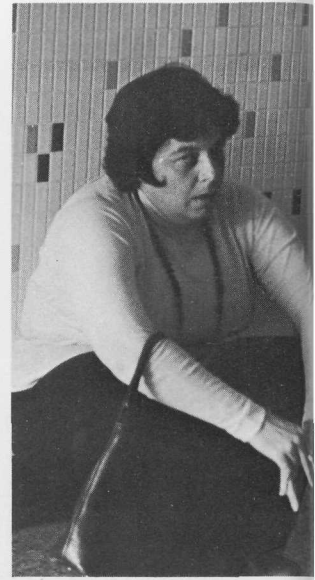
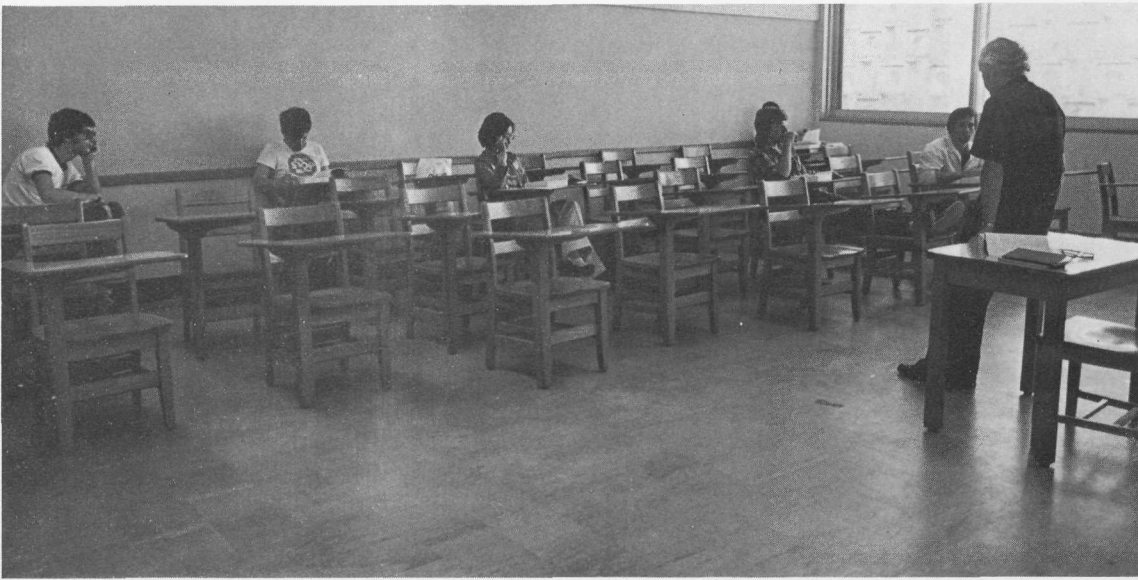

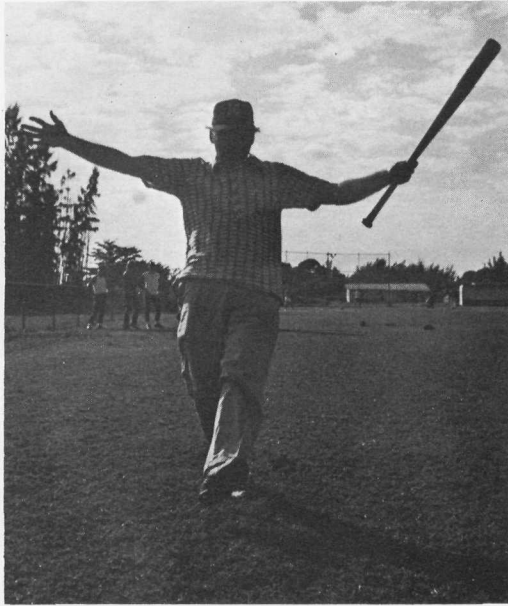




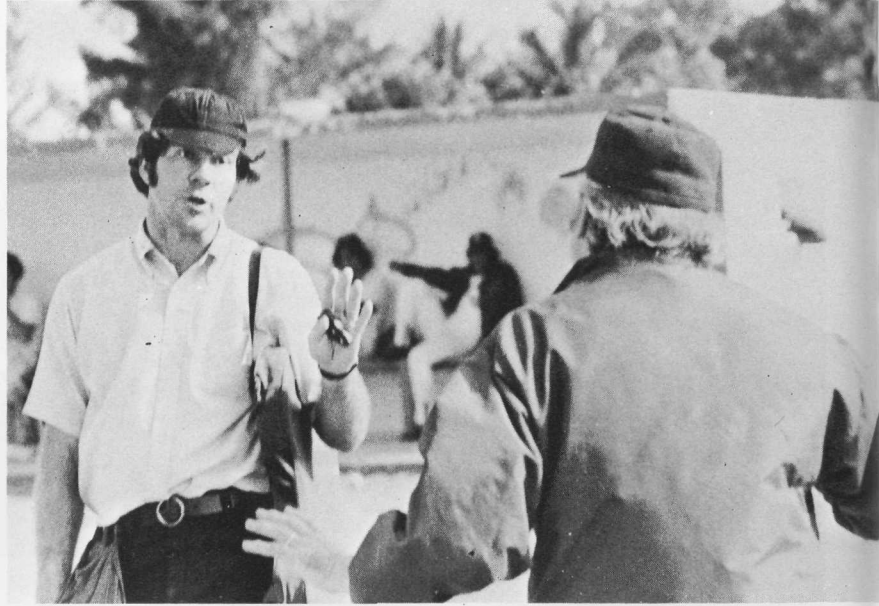
Well rounded, firmly shaped thighs, glisten under gym lights. Short, pleated skirts billow up and down as well planned screams and shouts flow back and forth the courts.

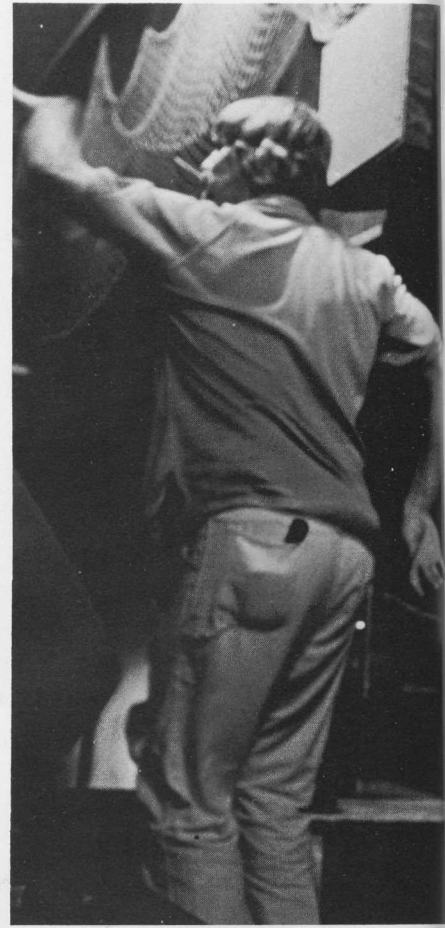


THE RAT
