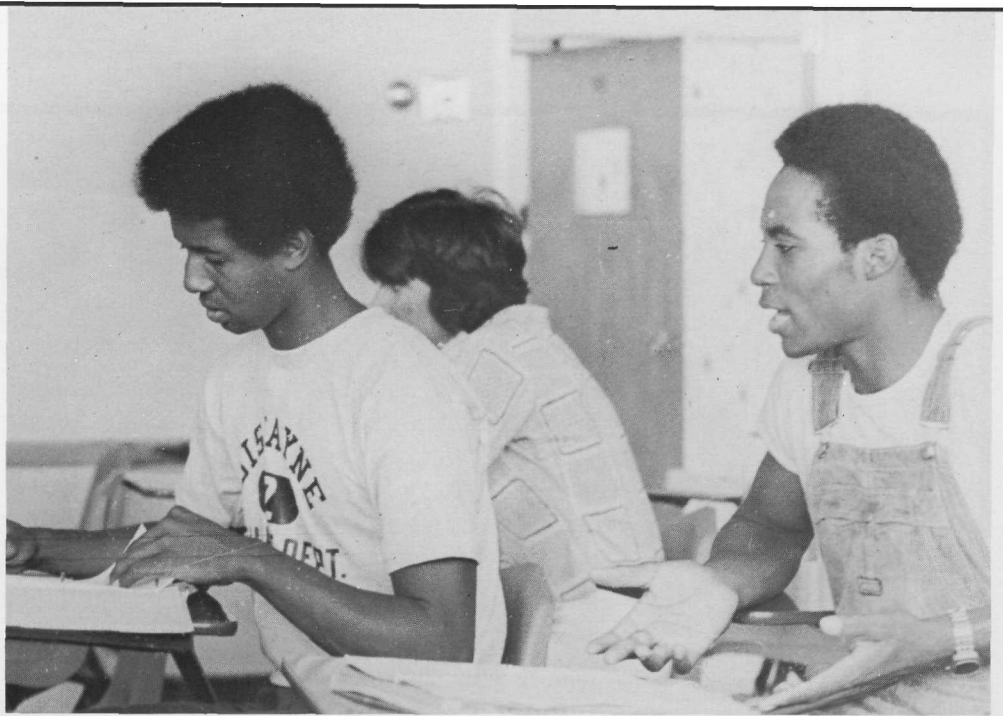
ORGANIZATIONS
