The following twelve words can say it best for us: "A teacher affects eternity, he can never tell where his influence stops."



Administration, Faculty and Staff

The need to produce well rounded individuals with an informed outlook at life's possibilities and challenges is amply met by Biscayne College's dedicated faculty and staff members. As a network of individuals they have given special time and effort to work honestly and harmoniously with the students' efforts to achieve their diverse educational goals. Such institutional capability is essential for the development of today's scholarships and tomorrow's transition to autonomy. In all respects, our administration, faculty and staff have provided an education that was truly a human developmental process.

TO THE SENIOR CLASS:

It has been my pleasure to have been associated with you over the last four years of your studies in variety of positions and, perhaps, know you better for that reason.

Surely, most of you, at one time or another have experienced a strong sense of frustration with the academic way, maybe, even a feeling of anger or despair. Some of you probably underwent this type emotion as early as the freshman year; others, much later. But, whenever it comes, this feeling produces in the student a sense of entrapment in a sterile, unchanging world while outside somewhere there awaits him a dynamic challenge in a relevant world of which he desires to form part.

That feeling, I must tell you, is not peculiar to those who attend Biscayne. It isn't even characteristic of the present generation of students.
