FOUNDING...

It was by no stray gust of wind, by no wandering insect, by no accidental agent that the important seed which was to become la Universidad de Santo Tomás de Villanova was planted. An inspiration came first followed by careful planning and untiring efforts, to accomplish this good for Cuba. This inspiration had its beginning in the mind of one person. Father Lorenzo Spirali, O. S. A. an Augustinian father, who has during his twenty years in Cuba, employed his talents and energetic efficiency in the construction of many worth-while projects for the benefit of the Cuban people and the church.

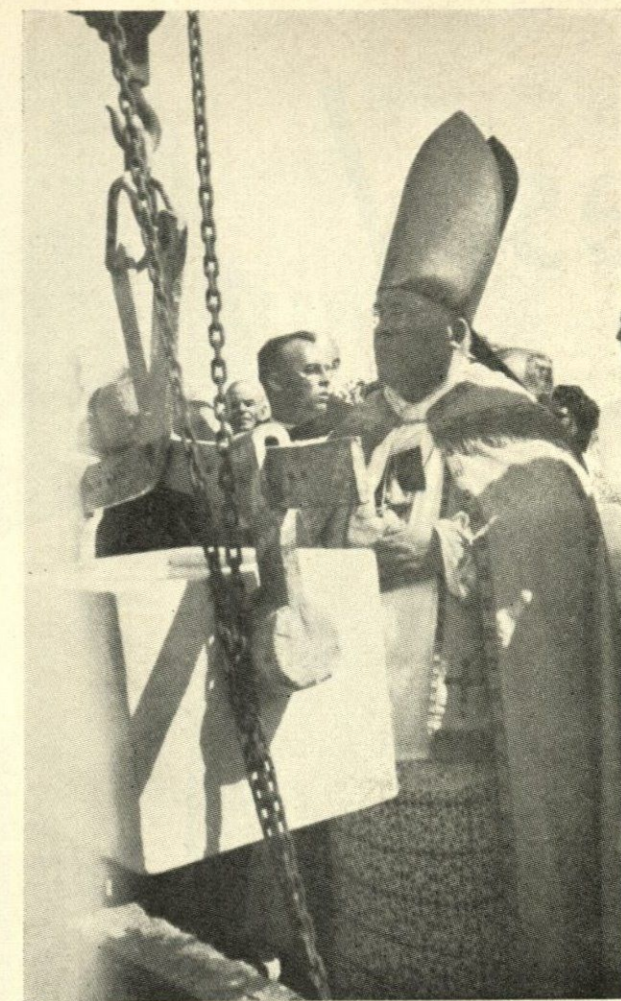
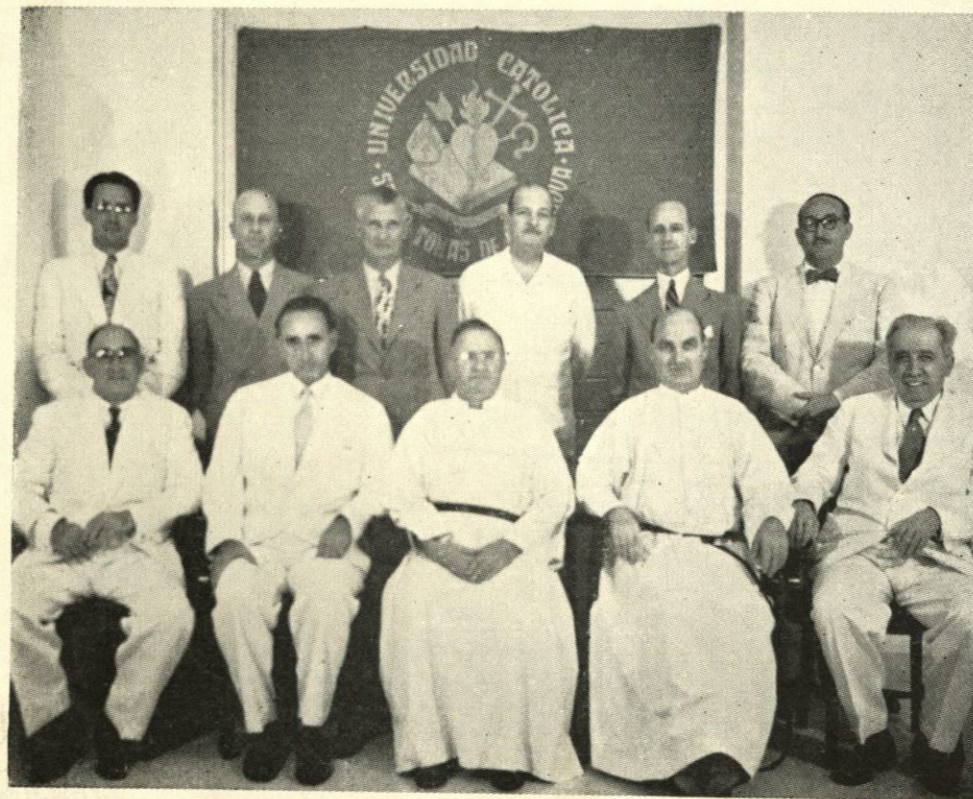
Inspiration, however, is not the sole measure of success. Perspiration resulting from deep thought and hard work plays a more important role in achieving success. The dynamic character of this industrious priest surged forth to interest prominent Cuban, educators, benefactors and high minded citizens of the need and good which could be derived from establishing a Catholic University.

To this plea, responded many of Cuba's most distinguished sons, who backed whole heartedly this movement contributing financially and with their special talents to lay the ground work for the founding of the university.

With the financial aid received mainly from devoted catholics in Cuba, Father Spirali undertook the task of construction, and on February 24, 1944 with a blessing by Cardinal Dennis Dougherty, the first corner stone of the chapel was laid. By October 1946, the school building and chapel were completed.

To the Very Rev. James M. Hurley, O. S. A., the responsibility of Rector of the University was confided. With the assistance of a few Augustinian Fathers and many of Cuba's most capable professors, La Universidad de Santo Tomás de Villanova was ready to open its doors to all who desired to further their education in the light of religious truth. On October 4, 1946 Cardinal Manuel Arteaga officially extended his blessings for the commencement of classes at the University.

Memories of my four Years at Villanova

When I look back and see the events of these last four years at Villanova, I marvel at the changes that have taken place and at the many good-byes and hellos we have had to say in this short time.

October 4, 1946—the first school day in Villanova's history—and our blue bus went through all the principal streets of Havana, expecting to fill all its seats with eager students, but only three arrived in the bus on that first school day. Having no drive-way yet, the bus parked by the side porch where the Fathers and professors were anxiously awaiting its arrival. We all went into the building and looked with amazement about us expecting to find someone we knew. Although there were many new faces, we made friends with one another immediately, and since we were thirty-two students in all, it really was one big happy family—some riding bicycles; some helping in the kitchen; and others playing ping-pong—all within our halls.

On October 1947, Villanova started its second school year and with many new students registered, our rules were changed, becoming a little stricter than before. Nevertheless, although we had grown much in number, still our family-life continued. The attraction to cooking was increased, and there were even rumors of starting a home economics course. Sports were greatly encouraged, and sometimes the whole student-body was transplanted to some nearby club for a basket-ball practice or a swim.

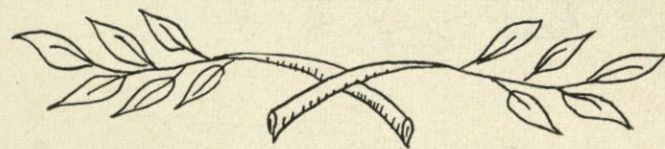
When we returned for our third-year, a new dean had arrived and both discipline and studies became stricter. Still, many excursions to Tarará, Morro Castle, Mariel, and to our neighboring "fincas" took place, and walks to our nearby market were made at almost any time of the day.

Last October, when we returned for our senior year, we found the administration building completed, and some of our boys registered as boarders, living in the beautiful new building.

As soon as classes started, talk about graduation, class rings and exams also started and we then wished that our studies were all over. However, as the months went by, we realized that this would be our last year at our dear Alma Mater and that soon we would have to say good-bye to it and to all the carefree and happy days we had spent there.

And now, alas!, our parting is here, and although we hope that Villanova will still grow much more, we hope that the spirit that has prevailed from its beginning will always continue.

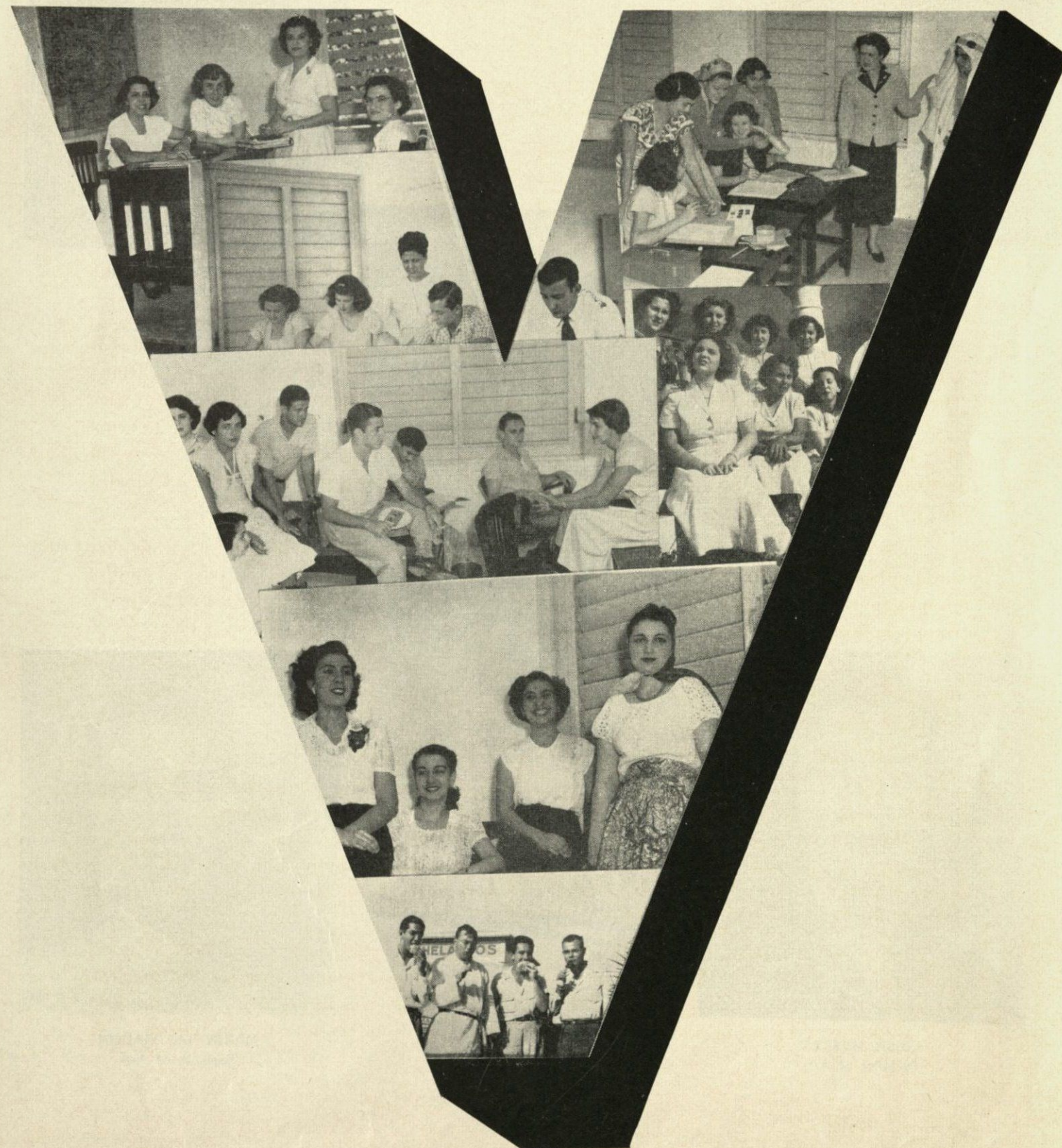
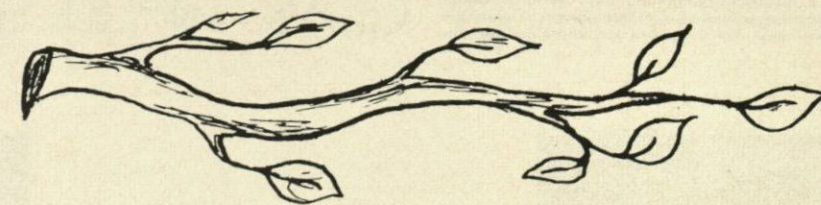
"Let's go" said the magician.
