You are now at a crossroads of your life. You need to make a choice as to how you will apply the education and values that you have assimilated here at St. Thomas University.



Or do you believe that your St. Thomas University degree has taught you to think in a certain way - with openness, tolerance and the humility that Socrates described as true wisdom?

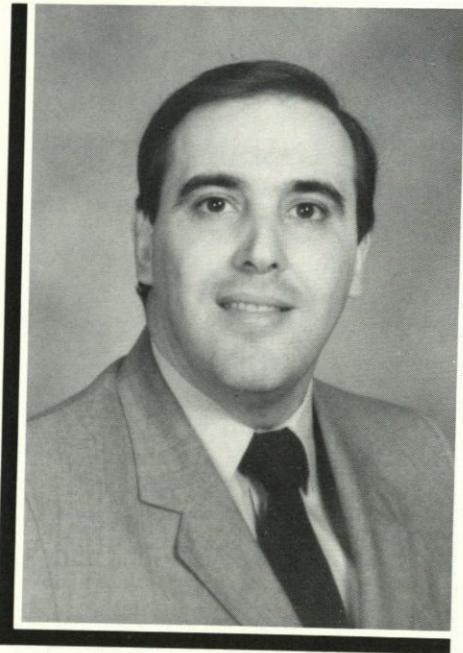
