












THE BOBCAT














BASKETBALL TEAM ADVANCES TO NATIONAL TOURNEY

Seniors Demetrius Permenter and Bobby Jones, under second year coach Gary Tuell, guided the Bobcats to a 10-4 conference record. The Bobcat squad won the Florida Sun Conference Tournament in 3 games, with their final game against Nova Southeastern University. The defeat of Nova guaranteed the Bobcat team a berth in the National Division II NAIA Tournament in Nampa, Idaho. With the leadership of Coach Tuell, the team became the first in St. Thomas University history to advance to the National Tournament.
















WOMEN'S SOCCER




WOMEN'S TENNIS
